## Policy Documents on Anti-Ragging in College

### 1. Preamble:

Given the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 8.05.2009 and in consideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging.

### 2. Objective:

- To eliminate ragging in all its forms from universities, deemed universities, and other higher educational institutions in the country by prohibiting it under these Regulations, preventing its occurrence, and punishing those who indulge in ragging as provided for in these Regulations and the appropriate law in force.
- The University Grants Commission, vide its letter no F.1-16/2007 (CPP-II) dated June 17, 2009, has reiterated the ban on the ragging of students in Institutions of Higher Learning. The students, therefore, were directed strictly to desist from any ragging.

### 3. Affidavit by students and parents:

Each student and their parents/ guardian shall have to furnish an affidavit along with the application form to the effect that they/he will not participate in or abet the act of ragging and that if they are found guilty, they shall be liable for punishment under the penal law of India

### 4. What is Ragging?

Ragging constitutes one or any of the following acts:



- a) Any conduct by any student or students, whether spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling a fresher or any other student with rudeness.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, torment, or embarrassment to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts, or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g) Any act of physical abuse, including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, or public insults, which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or show off power, authority, or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

#### 5. Ragging: Punishments

- a) The University Grants Commission, vide its letter no F.1-16/2007 (CPP-II) dated June 17, 2009, has reiterated the ban on the ragging of students in Institutions of Higher Learning.
- b) Punishment for Participation in/or Abetment of Ragging:
- c) Cancellation of admission





- d) Suspension from attending classes
  - e) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
  - f) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or another evaluation process
  - g) Withholding results
  - h) Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc
  - i) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
  - j) Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to 4 semesters or equivalent period
  - k) Expulsion from the college and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution
  - l) Fine up to Rs. 25,000/
6. Collective punishment:
- a) When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the college shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential triggers.
  - b) The students, therefore strictly directed to desist from any ragging.
